It was a powerful Jehu we saw in 2 Kings 10 as he went ahead fulfilling his mission of destroying the wicked house of Ahab. On one of his journeys, he met one of those respected men in the history of Israel called Jehonadab, the son of Rechab and as he gave him his hand, Jehu told him, "Come with me, and see my zeal for the LORD." So they had him ride in his chariot." (15-16). From there, they proceeded to where he killed all the remnants of the family of wicked Ahab, lured the prophets of Baal into a feast and destroyed all of them and their paraphernalia of worship. In fact, by the time we get to verse 18, the scriptures say, "Thus Jehu destroyed Baal from Israel." What a great man in action for the Lord. He was a real man of zeal.

Unfortunately, it was another Jehu we saw immediately after that. Verses 29-32 say, "However Jehu did not turn away from the sins of Jeroboam the son of Nebat, who had made Israel sin, that is, from the golden calves that were at Bethel and Dan... But Jehu took no heed to walk in the law of the LORD God of Israel with all his heart...In those days the LORD began to cut off parts of Israel; and Hazael conquered them in all the territory of Israel."

What is the gap between the Jehu we saw earlier and the one we saw later? It was his foundation. Jehu was never rooted in God. He was a product of circumstances. Elijah voluntarily retired from ministry when nobody was ready to stake his life for God and his word. In fact, he thought he was the only one left when God told him there were 7,000 who had not bowed to Baal. Jehu may have been one of these 7,000 hiding in the midst of apostasy. We never saw anything about the private life of Jehu as one who loved the word of God or

prayer, or sacrifice or bringing the people together, calling them to repentance and urging them to serve God. He was only full of activities and revenge. He could not sustain the light of revival which he sparkled.

It is good to be zealous for God. But zeal without knowledge is dangerous. You end up dissipating your energy without a commensurate result. You end up working for God without walking with him. Everyone may applaud you; even God may appreciate you. But your life will lack the root that can sustain you in the time of trials and temptation. That was what made Mary wiser than Martha. Mary sat at the feet of Christ to deepen her root. Martha was full of kitchen zeal for the master. When Lazarus died, we saw the reaction of the two of them.

I encourage you to be like Jehu, serving the Lord and loving him with all zeal but don't be like Jehu in demonstrating zeal alone. Settle down and learn. Settle down and deepen your root. Be a man or woman of balance. That is what can make you last in the ministry that God has called you to and qualify you for your reward both on earth and in heaven to come.
